- Make your own hotel reservation at Hampton Inn & Suites, 900 Post Road, Wells, Maine 04090 (207-646-0555). If you get bounced thru an automated registration system, when you get to a read person you may be told there are no rooms left and none reserved for League. Insist there are, and ask to be transferred to the hotel desk. They will be able to register you. Alternatively, try this number to reach the hotel itself: (207) 641-8419. The League of Women Voters room rate will be \$99 plus tax. Find a roommate to share, and the cost will be just a little over \$50 per person. Our block of rooms will be held until March 31.
