We are looking for volunteers to help with the 2026 New Hampshire Town Website Survey 

Participate in a New Hampshire civic tradition—it's time for the **2026 Town Website Survey!**

We need your help with an exciting project: a statewide audit of the official websites of New Hampshire's 234 municipalities to see how clearly they provide voting information. As you complete your assigned towns, you'll get to "travel" across New Hampshire virtually, exploring communities from the North Country to the Seacoast and discovering more of what our state has to offer along the way!  (You will do this from your own computer, at your own schedule.)

When someone moves to a new town, how easily can they find out how to register to vote?

Can they quickly locate the town clerk's hours, upcoming election information, or links to the Secretary of State's website for voter ID requirements? And, **critically**, do local websites accurately reflect the many [substantial voting law changes enacted in recent years?](#)  

To help answer these questions, we've created a short questionnaire with clear, step-by-step prompts.

Volunteers will each be assigned a small group of towns (8) and asked to complete the online questionnaire for each corresponding town website. Responses will be automatically recorded in a statewide tracking spreadsheet to help us identify gaps and opportunities to improve voter information access. All of this will be done on your own computer, when you have time.

To make participation easy, we'll also host a **brief volunteer training with time for questions** on Thursday, February 12 at 7PM, where we'll walk through the questionnaire and the process for locating voting information. ➔ [Click here to RSVP and sign up to participate](#)—once you register, we'll send you the instructions, questionnaire, and assigned list of towns. ◀ If you're unable to attend this training, let us know and we will send you a recording.

Our goal is to complete this review by March 1st. Afterward, we will share findings with local officials, provide recommendations and resources to help towns update their websites, and use the results to strengthen our voter education efforts. Past surveys have directly contributed to improved online voting information across the state.

This voter service project can be done whenever it's convenient for you—complete one town at a time, or finish your assignments all at once. **And if you find you're really getting into a groove, you're welcome to come back for more towns!**
